Doctor of Chiropractic Trimester One Supplies & iPad Requirement

Doctor's Bag & Equipment

All students entering the Doctor of Chiropractic Program will receive the supplies necessary to actively participate in clinical skills and chiropractic technique courses in the first trimester. These supplies include a doctor's bag that contains equipment that students will utilize during the clinical methods and diagnosis courses. This will allow students to train with the set of tools that they will use to aid in establishing a diagnosis on a patient during their time at Logan and for the rest of their career as a chiropractic physician. Students will also receive equipment that will assist them in their development of chiropractic technique skills, such as a speeder board for the second trimester Diversified Course and an Activator Adjusting Instrument for the Activator Course in the fourth trimester. The equipment and supplies are standard 'tools of the trade' in the chiropractic profession and it is our goal to give incoming students early exposure and use of this equipment so that they can continue to develop and refine their diagnostic and management skills as they progress towards their clinical experience. Cost allowances will be included in your tuition for financial aid purposes.

iPad Requirements

All students entering the Doctor of Chiropractic Program are required to have an iPad. Students will need their iPads beginning with the first day orientation sessions, where they will undergo instruction on the use of the iPad in learning and testing environments. The iPads will be used extensively to support instruction and facilitate communication throughout each student's time in the DC program. In addition, all examinations will be administered on iPads through an electronic testing environment (ExamSoft). Electronic testing allows students and faculty to monitor progress toward academic benchmarks at a detailed level, and helps to rapidly identify areas where tutoring or other resources may be needed to help students succeed.

The minimum model required is an iPad II however more recent iPads such as the iPad 3, iPad 4 (Retina Display) or iPad 5 (Air) are also acceptable for use. iPad Mini's are not recommended for use because the smaller screen size may place students at a disadvantage when testing or viewing educational material.

In order for the ExamSoft to run efficiently, the iPad must have:

- iOS 6 or 7
- 30% charge to commence a Secure Exam
- 500 MB of free space required to commence an exam
- Not been 'Jail Broken'
