Hour 9 covers Janda's Upper Crossed Syndrome, corrective mobilizers, inefficient stabilizers and evidence-based approach to forward head posture. In Hour 10 there is a discussion and demonstration of proper evaluation, rehab, and exercise intervention along with support treatment for headaches, cervical sprain/strain and cervical spondylosis. In Hour 11, Drs. Tucker and Denno cover cervical radiculopathy, Temporomandibular


