Backgrounder

Excellence in Education - A Logan College Fact Sheet

- Founded in 1935, Logan College of Chiropractic is a not-for-profit institution that is one of the largest chiropractic colleges or universities in North America.
- Logan offers its students a demanding curriculum, taught by highly qualified faculty, and state-of-the-art educational and learning facilities.
- Logan College of Chiropractic is situated on a beautiful 112-acre campus in Chesterfield, Mo., a western suburb of St. Louis. In fall 2007, MSNBC selected Logan's campus as an editor's pick as one of "America's Most Beautiful College Campuses."
- In addition to being an educational facility, Logan provides annual health care services to more than 3,600 new patients annually from the greater St. Louis area through its seven local health centers in the city of St. Louis, St. Louis County and nearby St. Charles County.
- In fiscal year 2009-2010, there were 45,000 patient visits in Logan's four fee-for-service clinics. When the free clinics are added, the patient visits total more than 53,000. There are approximately 273 interns working throughout the clinic system.
- Logan offers a science-based curriculum that includes courses in anatomy, physiology, microbiology, biochemistry, pathology, public health, two Bachelor of Science degrees in Human Biology and one in Life Sciences as well as the Doctor of Chiropractic degree and Master of Science degrees in Sports Science and Rehabilitation, and Nutrition and Performance. Advanced imaging diagnostics and clinical laboratory studies are part of the required curriculum during the five-year academic program.
- Logan College meets the highest academic and chiropractic professional standards and is fully accredited by the Council on Chiropractic Education's Commission on

Accreditation and the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools in cooperation with the U.S. Department of Education.

- Upon completion of the Doctor of Chiropractic degree, Logan offers its graduates residencies in radiology (three years), research (two years), and in sports injuries and Rehabilitation (two years).
- Since September 2006, Logan has offered a Master of Science degree in Sports Science and Rehabilitation. The program is open both to those who wish to earn concurrent M.S. and D.C. degrees, and to those students who have already earned a bachelor's degree and want to enroll to complete Master of Science study.
- Logan's Master of Science degree in Sports Science and Rehabilitation affords students numerous opportunities to participate in multidisciplinary clinical settings with professional, collegiate and high school sports teams. In addition, the state-of-the-art BIOFREEZE® Sports and Rehabilitation Center, under the direction of nationally-known sports chiropractor Laney Nelson, D.C., D.A.C.B.S.P., is located on the Logan campus and is specifically designed to treat athletic injuries.

Logan's newest Master of Science degree in Nutrition and Human Performance has been offered since January 2011.

- Since its founding, Logan has graduated more than 9,000 professionally trained doctors of chiropractic. More than 7,000 practice throughout the United States, Canada and around the world.
- Logan's current president is George A. Goodman, D.C., F.I.C.C., who has served in this position since January 1993. Dr. Goodman graduated from Logan in 1968 and has been a member of the college's faculty for more than 40 years.
