appropriate medical professional or co-management between a chiropractic doctor and a medical doctor or other health care professionals.

Campus: Logan College's 112-acre wooded campus is located in Chesterfield, Mo., quiet residential suburb of St. Louis. Though world-renowned for chiropractic education and care, Logan is a relatively small school with just over 1,100 students. Its low student-to-faculty ratio provides more personalized instruction, which is most conducive to effective learning.

Clinics: Logan College operates four fee-for-service chiropractic-teaching clinics. One is located on the main campus in Chesterfield and there are four satellite health centers in the St. Louis metropolitan area, in St. Louis County and St. Charles County. The college also operates two charitable clinics, one in conjunction with the Salvation Army and the other at St. Patrick's Center in the city of St. Louis. Logan also provides chiropractic clinical services on a part-time basis at the Department of Veterans Affairs' Jefferson Barracks facility in south St. Louis County.

Library: The Learning Resources Center (LRC) houses the Library, Computer Lab, and Distance Learning Hub. A \$4.2 million renovation of the 15,000-square foot facility was completed in 2004. The LRC provides a collection of approximately 12,500 volumes, 260 journal titles, 23,050 items of media, and an outstanding collection osseous and synthetic model. Also featured are 75 computer work stations, group and individual study facilities, a variety of electronic data bases, and a state-of-the-art video-conferencing facility.

Alumni: Over the years, more than 9,000 doctors of chiropractic have graduated from Logan College. Today, Logan alumni are operating successful practices throughout the United States, Canada and many other nations. In fact, many of them are officers of various national chiropractic associations and state boards of examination.

Chiropractic

Patients: The types of patients whom chiropractors see in their practices represent a broad cross section of society no different than might be seen by any other health care professionals. Doctors of chiropractic treat more female patients for a variety of ailments. Problems classified as neuromusculoskeletal account for approximately 85 percent of all conditions treated by chiropractors. Doctors of chiropractic are

part of the U.S. military health care team and are located in select military treatment facilities of the armed services. The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs provides chiropractic care to our nation's veterans.

Licensing and

Standards: The Doctor of Chiropractic degree is a first professional degree as are Doctors of Medicine and Osteopathy. These degree holders are the only members of the healing arts who are educated and licensed to diagnose and treat the entire body. As a member of a qualified branch of the healing arts, the chiropractic professional is licensed in all states, the District of Columbia as well as in Canada, Puerto Rico and multiple foreign countries.

All licensed chiropractors are entitled by law to use either the title Doctor of Chiropractic and/or Chiropractic Physician. They are charged by law for the care and responsibility of their patients and are licensed and trained to be direct access primary care doctors. The National Board exams given to chiropractic students consist of four parts. Upon successful completion of all four parts, students who graduate from Logan College can practice in 46 states without further state board examinations.
