

This weekend Dr. Suzanne Seekins presents Session #2 of the threesession 36-hour Pediatric Certificate Course. In this session Dr. Seekins begins with Pre-Natal Development of the Cranium. This discussion includes material on the most common pediatric conditions with known cranial etiologies. In hours two and three she presents Pre-Natal Treatment of Gravid Female to Prevent Cranial Distortion Patterns. These hours are devoted to the gravid female in various manageable conditions that respond favorably to chiropractic intervention. We are extremely excited to have this 3-session 36hour Certification Course back on our campus. The Performance Health Rehab Certification Course is taught by nationally known teachers Jeffrey Tucker, DC, DACRB, and Deborah Denno, DC. They also teach the POLITE acronym: Plan, Optimal Loading, Instruments, Tape, Exercise. This is a jam-packed weekend with lots of workshops and hands-on practice. If you attended Dr. Tucker's two-hour session at the 2017 Spring Symposium you know you are in for a treat. He's a great instructor! The course is

September 8-9, 2018 Performance Health Rehab Certificate - Session #2 Instructors: Jeffrey H. Tucker, DC, DACRB and Deborah Joan Denno, DC



The 36-hour Rehab Specialist Certification Program continues this weekend with Session # 2 taught by Dr. Jeffrey Tucker and Dr. Deborah Denno. In this session Drs. Tucker and Denno discuss the evaluation process. They demonstrate tests to perform that lead to (DET) diagnosis/exercise intervention/ taping considerations. They discuss outcomes as-

sessment with each assessment test explained. In Hour 3 they describe in-office and at-home rehab equipment to be used throughout the DET, including Scoliosis - diagnosis, exercise, taping; and Kyphosis - diagnosis, exercise, and taping. In Hour 4 they cover breathing assessment. rib fracture and contusion, and the Thoracic Outlet Syndrome protocols. In Hour 5 Drs. Tucker and Denno discuss squat evaluation and interpretation of feet, knees, lumbopelvic hip complex and cervical spine. Hour 6 is a workshop on lumbar erector spinae strain with diagnosis, exercise and taping. Hour 7 includes sciatica versus piriformis diagnosis. In Hour 8 they discuss stenosis, spondylolisthesis, and sacroiliac joint diagnosis, exercise and taping. This hour includes a workshop on lumbar stabilization assessments, exercises and posterior chain reprogramming.



Hour 9 covers Janda's Upper Crossed Syndrome, corrective mobilizers, inefficient stabilizers and evidence-based approach to forward head posture. In Hour 10 there is a discussion and demonstration of proper evaluation, rehab, and exercise intervention along with support treatment for headaches, cervical sprain/strain and cervical spondylosis. In Hour 11. Drs. Tucker and Denno cover cervical radiculopathy, Temporomandibular Dysfunction and chronic

neck pain patients. They wrap up this excellent seminar by helping us put it all together in the office. The course is taught by Dr. Jeffrey Tucker and Dr. Deborah Denno. Jeffrey H. exact functions; superficial cycle of chi flow and deep cycle of chi flow; the vital substances, identification of patterns, a detailed study of Lung Meridian Patterns and a detailed study of Large Intestine Meridian as well as an introduction to tongue diagnosis, pulse diagnosis, cupping and moxa. 

The Musculoskeletal Diagnostic
Ultrasound Certification Course
Introduction and Cross-Sectional
Imaging - Session #1

Logan University's College of Chiropractic Postgraduate Department is proud to present the Musculoskeletal Diagnostic Ultrasound Certification Course. This is the profession's first and only certification course in musculoskeletal diagnostic ultrasound. The course is open to all Doctors of Chiropractic and is presented by some of the profession's most qualified expert instructors. The Musculoskeletal Diagnostic Ultrasound Certification Course will provide 120 hours of training in the application of ultrasound imaging to the musculoskeletal system. This course is targeted toward clinicians, particularly those with interest in increasing their knowledge and skill in diagnosis and management of musculoskeletal conditions of the upper and lower extremities. This course is comprehensive and will lead to a certification in the utilization of ultrasound to generate and interpret ultrasound images of the musculoskeletal system. Didactic sessions followed by hands-on training will allow the immediate application of knowledge and improve skill development. Correlation with anatomic imaging and specimens will enhance the participants' knowledge base. All imaging and clinical protocols are evidence-based. Expert faculty will provide instruction and feedback in all sessions. This a 120-hour intensive course with a hands-on review of the anatomy of the extremities. The training incudes the shoulder, elbow, wrist, and hand modules as well as hip, knee, ankle, and foot modules. Each session will include normal ultrasound of the part, ultra-



sound of musculoskeletal pathologies, a scanning lab and anatomical correlation. The certification course requires a 10-month commitment, but will certainly be worth it since diagnostic ultrasound competes with MRI for some diagnoses, and would be much more affordable for the practicing DC

and his/her patients. The increased knowledge and additional skills will result in better patient outcomes and, perhaps, increased income. It may also eliminate the need to refer some cases out for MRI since they can now be diagnosed in office. Session #1 is taught by Dr. Dan Haun who says that participants will learn and review anatomy of the neuromusculoskeletal system as imaged with magnetic resonance imaging and ultrasound; become familiar with the pathoanatomy of common neuromusculoskeletal conditions of the spine and extremities; and will discuss evidence-based algorithms and treatment protocols for common neuromusculoskeletal conditions. This first session is taught by Daniel W. Haun, DC, DACBR. Dr. Haun is a 2004 graduate of Logan College of Chiropractic. He is a Diplomate of the American Chiropractic Board of Radiology. Dr. Haun is an instructor in the Clinical Science Division and Chiropractic Science Division of Logan University. He is an expert in diagnostic ultrasound and brings his considerable expertise to this 12hour presentation. Session #1 may be taken as a stand-alone seminar or as a first step to certification in musculoskeletal diagnostic ultrasound imaging. This discussion includes an introduction to KISS Syndrome (Kinematic Imbalance due to Sub-occipital Strain) and upper cervical issues. The presentation includes spinal examination and correction of the occiput, cervical, thoracic and lumbar, and sacral spine. Following this presentation Dr. Seekins provides ample time to workshop the treatments and material covered. In Hours 5 and 6 Dr. Seekins describes and discusses Latching and Sucking Disorders. This discussion includes anatomy, diagnosis, and correction. Corrective techniques with a hands-on workshop will be covered as well. In Hours 6 and 7 she presents Gastrointestinal Problems and includes anatomy, diagnosis, and correction. In this section she provides a review of anatomy and physiology of the gut with diagnosis and treatment for conditions such as GERD, or GER, colic and more. An 8-step organ protocol will be taught as well as correction of associated spinal levels and cranial issues that may be involved with GI problems. A workshop on protocol for GI issues will also be provided. In Hours 8 and 9 Dr. Seekins discusses Otitis Media, and in Hours 10

They also provide a workshop on static posture evaluation and an introduction to Fascial System (Anterior Oblique System, Posterior Oblique System and Lateral System). In Hour 4 Drs. Tucker and Denno present the Posterior Chain Reprogramming workshop with the use of the CLX band and the Stretch Strap. In Hour 5 they present workshops on Anterior Chain Reprogramming. They wrap up Saturday with a presentation on the shoulder – diagnosis, exercise therapy and taping techniques. On Sunday Drs. Tucker and Denno continue with treatment of shoulder conditions. 


