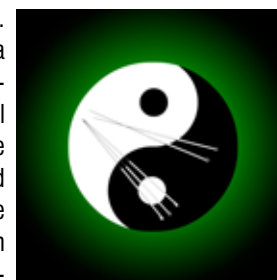

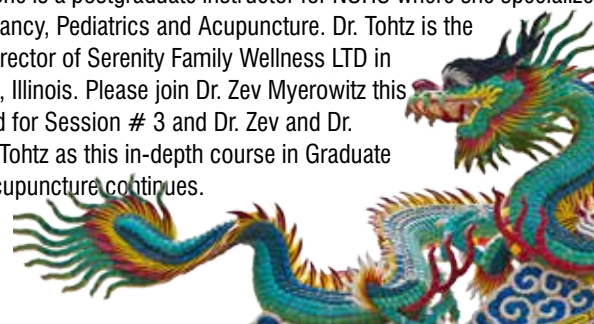

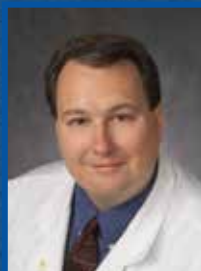

The Pediatric Seminar: Review of Pediatric History and Physical Examination, Including Child Abuse and Neglect; Maybe That's Just a Sprain...Bad Things with Benign Presentations
Instructor: Randy Ferrance, DC, MD, FHM

This weekend we welcome Dr. Randy Ferrance to our campus to present a very important seminar on pediatrics, child abuse reporting, and medical conditions and emergencies. Dr. Ferrance is a chiropractor and an MD who is board certified in internal medicine. He is licensed in Virginia to practice both chiropractic and medicine. He believes that communication between DCs and MDs is essential for truly integrated health care. In this 12-hour seminar Dr. Ferrance discusses the major differences and similarities between history-taking in adults and children, so that we can better understand the pathophysiologic basis of worrisome physical exam findings. He discusses yellow flags indicating urgent need for referral, and red flags indicating emergent need for referral. He presents a review of the pediatric examination and the common normal and abnormal findings on the examination. Dr. Ferrance continues with issues in the treatment of the adolescent regarding growth, development, and psychological issues as well as privacy issues and difficult conversations. On Sunday Dr. Ferrance discusses recognition of child abuse and

neglect, and includes information to help us have a better appreciation for when to have an increased index of suspicion in thinking about child abuse and to better understand how referrals can be made to help protect at-risk children. He also covers common injuries of abuse as well as conditions that can mimic abuse. Dr. Ferrance wraps up this important seminar with a discussion of infections, trauma, visceral problems, fractures and overuse syndromes. The class is taught by Randy Ferrance, DC, MD, FHM. 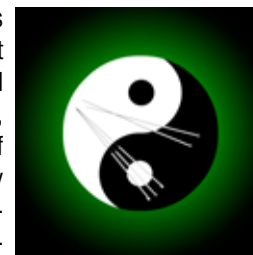

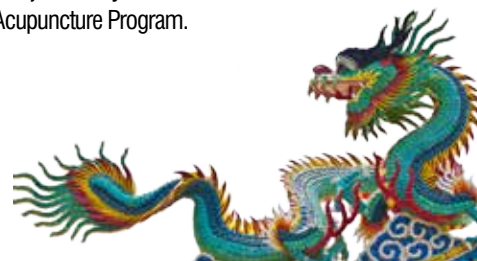

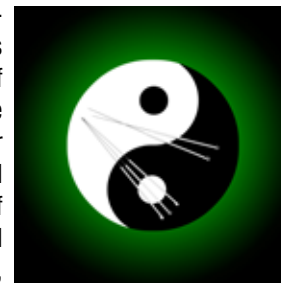
