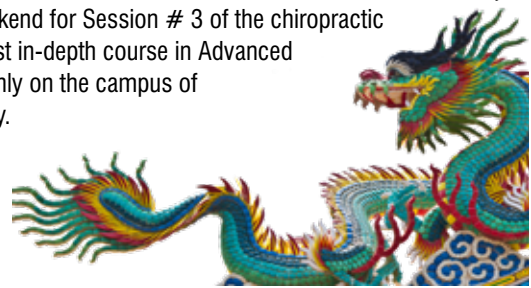

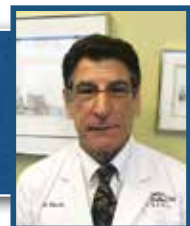

January 20-21, 2018
DeFlame Your Patients with Diet and Supplements
Instructor: David Seaman, DC, DABCN

We are pleased to welcome back to our campus one of the profession's premier experts on inflammation and how to reduce and prevent it. Dr. David Seaman says, "As little as 15 years ago diet and inflammation was not a hot topic of interest. But now information abounds regarding the relationship between diet and inflammation. In this session, learn how a dietary excess of sugar, flour and refined oils create chronic inflammation. This occurs via postprandial hyperglycemia and endotoxemia, each of which can become a chronic state in the fasting state. By addressing chronic inflammation properly, we can target the underlying cause of most chronic conditions, such as obesity, metabolic syndrome, diabetes, interstitial cystitis, depression, migraine headache and other pain syndromes." Dr. Seaman lists the learning objectives of the seminar as: discuss how sugar, flour and refined oils can inflame the body; identify foods that promote dietary inflammation and weight gain; discuss why supplements alone cannot adequately deflame the body; introduce a diet and supplements to reduce chronic inflammation, rather than attempting to target a specific organ, appears to be a rational clinical approach for addressing the issue of toxicity. This is an information-packed seminar, and it is information that you can use right away. Dr. Seaman begins with the expression of chronic inflammation, then

discusses how gut bacteria augment the diet-induced inflammatory state. He then presents the DeFlaming Process—Lifestyle including stress management, sleep and exercise; the DeFlaming Process – Diet which includes the standard DeFlame diet and the Ketogenic DeFlame diet. He also covers vitamin D, magnesium and fish oil, and anti-inflammatory botanicals, proteolytic enzymes and probiotics. In hour 7 he discusses the clinical application for autism and the mother, and autism and the child. In hour 9 he discusses the clinical application for disc herniation and discogenic pain. He discusses clinical application in depression/anxiety. In hour 11 he discusses clinical application in aging, and he wraps up this outstanding presentation with a review of various conditions in relation to chronic inflammation. He includes the anti-inflammatory diet and anti-inflammatory supplements. This class is taught by Dr. David R. Seaman. David R. Seaman, DC DABCN is a 1986 graduate of New York Chiropractic College. 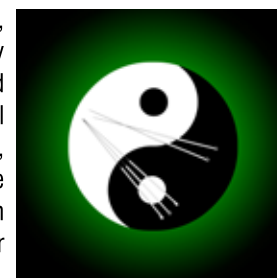

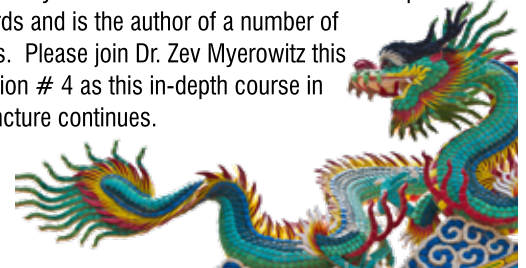

This weekend we welcome Dr. Phil Harrington to our campus. Dr. Harrington is a well-known and well-respected expert in the use of class IV therapeutic lasers and brings his expertise to the campus of Logan University for the first time, this weekend. Dr. Harrington begins this comprehensive presentation with the discussion of why you should implement laser therapy in your practice. He discusses the history of lasers, laser physics and equipment design, laser tissue interaction and laser safety. He outlines dosage, treatment and delivery techniques and addresses common questions about laser therapy. In hour 7 Dr. Harrington describes combining class IV laser therapy with other techniques. He presents a literature review and provides examples of various cases with imaging, treatment plans and outcomes. He then discusses treatment protocols including dosage review, acute versus chronic conditions, spinal conditions, extremity conditions, pediatric

and geriatric patients, and sports injuries. In hour 11 he discusses neuropathy, and then ends the seminar with hands-on demonstrations.
