About Accreditation

The goal of accreditation is to ensure that education provided by institutions and/or programs of higher education meets acceptable levels of quality.

Accrediting agencies, such as the HLC, are private educational associations of regional and national scope, who develop evaluation criteria and conduct peer evaluations to external and internal constituencies.

Accreditation is merit-based on an institution's ability to meet the established criteria and standards.



Criterion 2: Integrity: Ethical and Responsible Conduct

The HLC's second criterion evaluates Logan's integrity, making sure its conduct is ethical and responsible.

- Does Logan establish and follow policies and processes to ensure fair and ethical behavior on the part of its governing board, administration, faculty and staff?
- Does Logan present itself clearly and completely to its students and to the public?
- Is the governing board autonomous to make decisions in the best interest of the university in compliance with board policies and Logan's integrity?
- Is Logan committed to academic freedom and freedom of expression in the pursuit of truth in teaching and learning?
- Do our policies and procedures call for responsible acquisition, discovery and application of knowledge by its faculty, staff and students?
