

Purpose of Assessment

The purpose of this assessment was to obtain information regarding the graduate school and employment outcomes for Logan University alumni.

Methods

Career Services (CS) adheres to the National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE) standards for collecting outcomes data at various intervals within the nine months preceding and following graduation.

Beginning December 12, 2019, CS administered the First Destination and Exit Surveys electronically through Handshake to Logan University students on track to confer an undergraduate, masters, or doctoral degree for the Fall 2019 trimester. CS team members continued to follow up with graduates and collect data through the Handshake platform, by conducting phone calls, through direct email inquiries, and by obtaining information provided in LinkedIn profiles.

Description of Participants


This report includes data from surveys administered to 178 Logan University alumni earning Bachelor’s, Master’s, or Doctorate degrees during the Fall 2019 trimester. Of that total, Career Services was able to verify the status of 129 alumni representing an overall response/knowledge rate of 72.5%.


Findings

Out of 129 alumni responses, 109 (84.5%) were found to be employed full time, nine (6.98%) were continuing their education, one alumni (.78%) was not seeking employment and ten graduates (7.75%) were actively seeking employment. 91.5% of Logan University graduates from the fall 2019 trimester were found to be satisfactorily occupied within nine months of graduation. 
Bachelors Programs

Career Services verified the status of four current students or alumni pursuing a bachelor's degree. Three indicated that they were currently working (75%), one (25%) was not seeking employment. Graph below.



Masters Programs

Results obtained from 51 alumni enrolled in Logan’s master’s degree programs indicate that 45 (88%) were working, three (6%) were continuing their education, and six (13%) were still seeking employment. 87% of Logan’s master’s degree graduates were satisfactorily occupied within nine months of graduation. Health Informatics

Career Services was able to verify the status of seven *Health Informatics* alumni. Six respondents (86%) reported that they were working full-time, one (14%) reported plans to pursue additional education. Five of the employed respondents are working in the field of healthcare. One employed respondent indicated that they were working in the research field. Table below.

Nutrition and Human Performance

Data collected from thirty *Nutrition and Human Performance* alumni indicated that twenty-five (86.2%) were employed. 6.7% respondents indicated they were planning to enroll in Logan's Doctor of Health Professions Education program. Three (10.3%) alumni were actively seeking employment.

Master of Science in Sports Science and Rehabilitation


Sports Science and Rehabilitation (SSR) alumni supplied thirteen survey responses. Twelve alumni (92%) were found to be working. One (14%) SSR graduate indicated that they were still seeking employment. Table below.

Doctoral Programs

Career Services obtained information from seventy-five survey participants enrolled in a doctoral program. Data indicated that sixty-two (82.7%) were working. Seven (9.3%) graduates in the DC program needed to complete additional coursework. Six (8%) DC graduates reported that they were still seeking employment. Graph below.



All of the employed DC graduates were found to be working in chiropractic-related positions. Career Services obtained data for one DHPE graduate who is currently employed at Logan University.

Conclusions/Implications/Recommendations

This report contains information obtained from the second round of first destination surveys conducted through the Career Services office. We will continue to administer the survey and collect data using the same methodology in upcoming trimesters to make determinations regarding resources and support for subsequent trimesters.
