

Updated CDC/STL County Guidelines on Isolation/Quarantine

Logan Faculty or Staff who test positive for COVID or have had a known exposure should contact their immediate supervisor for guidance before reporting to campus.

On-campus students who test positive for COVID or have had a known exposure should contact Student Affairs for guidance before reporting to campus.

The following is a synopsis on the updated guidance on isolation when testing positive for COVID as well as for those that have had a close contact exposure to COVID from the CDC:

- If you test positive for COVID, you should isolate for 5 days and may return to campus after that period (if asymptomatic) and wear a mask for 5 additional days. This is regardless of your vaccination/boosted status.
- If you have a close contact exposure and have completed your vaccine **AND** have received a booster, you may return to campus and wear a mask for 10 days.
- If you have a close contact exposure and have completed your vaccine over 6 months ago and have **not** had a booster **OR** are unvaccinated, you should isolate for 5 days and may return to campus after that period (if asymptomatic) and wear a mask for 5 additional days.
