August 2021 Graduate Outcomes

Career Services

Purpose of Assessment

The purpose of this assessment was to obtain information regarding the graduate school and employment outcomes for Logan University alumni.

Methods

Career Services (CS) adheres to the National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE) standards for collecting outcomes data at various intervals within the nine months preceding and following graduation.

CS administered the First Destination and Exit Surveys electronically through Handshake to Logan University students on track to confer an undergraduate, masters, or doctoral degree for the Spring 2021 trimester. CS team members continued to follow up with graduates and collect data through the Handshake platform, by conducting phone calls, through direct email inquiries, and by obtaining information provided in LinkedIn profiles.

Description of Participants

This report includes data from surveys administered to 192 Logan University alumni earning Bachelor's, Master's, or Doctorate degrees during the Fall 2021 trimester. Of that total, Career Services was able to verify the status of 103 alumni representing an overall response/knowledge rate of 54%.

Findings

Out of 103 alumni responses, 88 (85%) were found to be employed full or part time, six (5.8%) were continuing their education, one (.097%) and eight graduates (7.8%) were actively seeking employment. 91% of Logan University graduates from the fall 2019 trimester were found to be satisfactorily occupied within nine months of graduation. Bachelors Programs

Career Services verified the status of fourteen graduates from bachelor's degree programs. Eight (57%) graduates reported that they were working. Four (29%) students indicated that they were planning to continue their education. Two (14%) graduates indicated that they were still seeking employment. 86% of Logan's undergraduates were found to be satisfactorily occupied. Graph below.



Masters Programs

Results obtained from 41 alumni enrolled in Logan's master's degree programs indicate that 37 (90%) were working full or part-time, one (2%) was volunteering, and three (7%) were still seeking employment. 92% of Logan's master's degree graduates were satisfactorily occupied within nine months of graduation. Graph below.



Applied Nutrition and Dietetics

All three graduates who supplied responses from the Applied Nutrition and Dietetics program (100%) were working in the field of healthcare. One graduate reported a part-time position serving as a health coach. Two graduates reported working full-time as dietitians.

Nutrition and Human Performance

Data collected from 17 *Nutrition and Human Performance* alumni indicated that 16 (94%) were employed. One (6%) respondent indicated they were actively seeking employment.

Master of Science in Sports Science and Rehabilitation


Sports Science and Rehabilitation (SSR) alumni supplied 21 survey responses. 18 alumni (86%) were found to be employed. One (4.7%) graduate reported doing volunteer work with a therapy & wellness organization. Two (9.5%) SSR graduates indicated that they were still seeking employment. Table below.

Doctoral Programs

Career Services obtained information from 46 survey participants enrolled in a doctoral program. Data indicated that 43 (93.5%) were working full or part-time. Three (6.5%) DC graduates reported that they were still seeking employment. Graph below.



Doctorate of Chiropractic

Chiropractic Students supplied 43 responses. Forty (80%) were found to be employed full time or working as an independent contractor. Three (16%) graduates indicated that they intended to seek further education. One (4%) SSR graduate indicated that they were still seeking employment. Table below.

Doctor of Health Professions

Career Services received three responses from students graduating from the DHPE program. All three (100%) were found to be employed full time. Two were working in higher education and one student was employed in a K-12 setting . Table below.
