NBCE EXAM APPLICATION PROCESS

- 1. Go to <u>www.mynbce.org</u>
 - Click on the "Apply for Exam" button
 - a. If this is your first time applying for an exam
 - Click the "Register as an Examinee"
 - Register your Account
 - Click Submit
 - b. If this is not your first time then login-in with your account information
 - Please email support@nbce.org or call 800-964-6223 for assistance if trouble logging-in
- 2. Select which exam you would like to apply
 - Being Application
 - Click Submit
 - Examinee's "submit" button will change to "Awaiting Registrar Approval"
- 3. A Logan NBCE Exam Application will be sent to the examinee's Logan email address within 1-2 business days
 - Students will need to complete the electronic form in order to be considered for Registrar approval
 - If the Logan NBCE Exam Application is approved, then the NBCE application will be approved on the same business day
- 4. Complete the "Accommodation Request Application" if accommodations are needed
- 5. "Awaiting Registrar Approval" button will change to "Schedule Appointment" if approved by Registrar
- 6. Agree to Affidavit
 - Click Continue
- 7. Payment page will populate
 - Complete the credit card information fields
 - Click "Complete Purchase"
- 8. "Payment Confirmation" page will populate
 - Click "Continue Application"
- 9. A "Payment Confirmation" email will be sent to the examinee's email address that was used to create the NBCE account.
 - Click on the link in them email to schedule your exam date
- 10. Schedule/Reschedule Exam
 - Confirm Privacy Policy
 - Enter zip code for where you would like to take the exam (63017 for Logan)
 - Select the date and available time slot for your exam
 - Examinees are responsible for scheduling exam dates that abide by the eligibility requirements (See NBCE Eligibility Requirements and Approval process or email <u>Tatiana.Johnson@logan.edu</u> with questions)
- 11. Appointment Confirmation page will populate

PLAN ACCORDINGLY: Examinees must complete the entire application process prior to 5pm MTN on the Application Deadline day listed below in order to meet the application deadline. The process includes: begin application, receive Registrar and other applicable approval(s), pay, <u>AND</u> submit/confirm scheduling all prior to the deadline. Scheduling shuts off at 5pm MTN (7 pm ET, 6 pm CT, 4 pm PT). If the application deadline is missed, future administrations will be available for scheduling. After the application deadline, no late entries, cancellations, or re-scheduling will be allowed.

- **Individual Domain Retakes (IDRs) and Physiotherapy (PHT) exams are available on Saturday afternoons.
 *** The November Part IV Application deadline is before the score release of the August Part I exam. August Part I examinees will have to plan on scheduling in 2024 for Part IV, if eligible.
- When scheduling for both Part III and PHT, leave enough time for both appointments. They are separate exams. Also, they do not have to be taken during the same administration.

NBCE Board Eligibility Requirements & Approval Process:

The National Board of Chiropractic Examiners (NBCE) administers a series of standardized tests to assess knowledge and competency in the basic sciences and clinical subjects relevant for Chiropractic licensure. Students will be required to successfully complete Part I, Part II, Part II, Part IV, and a Physiotherapy exam to apply for state Chiropractic licensure. More information about the NBCE boards can be found at: <u>https://mynbce.org/</u>.

Students are required to sign-up for NBCE exams through the NBCE website <u>and</u> complete the Logan NBCE Exam Application sent by the Licensure Boards Coach (LBC), to be considered for exam approval. Applications will <u>not</u> be considered for approval by the LBC until the student has entered the Trimester of Eligibility. The LBC will send a Logan University NBCE Exam Application to the applicant's Logan email address once the NBCE application has been submitted for approval.

Eligibility Requirements to sit for NBCE Exams:

NBCE and Logan University have specific eligibility requirements to sit for exams. Information for both can be found through the NBCE website, and the Logan University Academic Catalog under "Licensing Boards Examinations (pg.16)".

Part I: Students must successfully complete all courses through the end of trimester 4 with a passing grade and have a CGPA of 2.25 (2.0 for students matriculating prior to Fall 2017) or higher prior to taking Part I.

Part II: Students must successfully complete all courses through the end of trimester 7 with a passing grade, pass all sections of part I, and have a CGPA of 2.25 (2.0 for students matriculating prior to Fall 2017) or higher prior to taking Part II.

Part III: Students must successfully complete courses all through the end of trimester 7 with a passing grade, pass all sections of part I and part II, and have a CGPA of 2.25 (2.0 for students matriculating prior to Fall 2017) or higher prior to taking Part III. Part III cannot be taken more than nine months prior to the student's expected graduation date.

Part IV: Students must successfully complete courses through the end of trimester 8 with a passing grade, passed all portions of Part I, Part II, and Part III, and have a CGPA of 2.25 (2.0 for students matriculating prior to Fall 2017) or higher prior to taking Part IV. Part IV cannot be taken more than six months prior to the student's expected graduation date.

Physiotherapy: Students must successfully complete courses through the end of trimester 7 with a passing grade, must have successfully completed 120 hours of instruction in physiotherapy, before the NBCE application deadline, and have a CGPA of 2.25 (2.0 for students matriculating prior to Fall 2017) or higher prior to taking NBCE's Physiotherapy examination. The exam cannot be taken more than six months prior to the student's expected graduation date.
