

Purpose of Assessment

The purpose of this assessment was to obtain information regarding the graduate school and employment outcomes for Logan University alumni.

Methods

Career Services (CS) adheres to the National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE) standards for collecting outcomes data at various intervals within the nine months preceding and following graduation.

CS administered the First Destination and Exit Surveys electronically through Handshake to Logan University students on track to confer an undergraduate, masters, or doctoral degree for the Summer 2022 trimester. CS team members continued to follow up with graduates and collect data through the Handshake platform, by conducting phone calls, through direct email inquiries, and by obtaining information provided in LinkedIn profiles.

Description of Participants

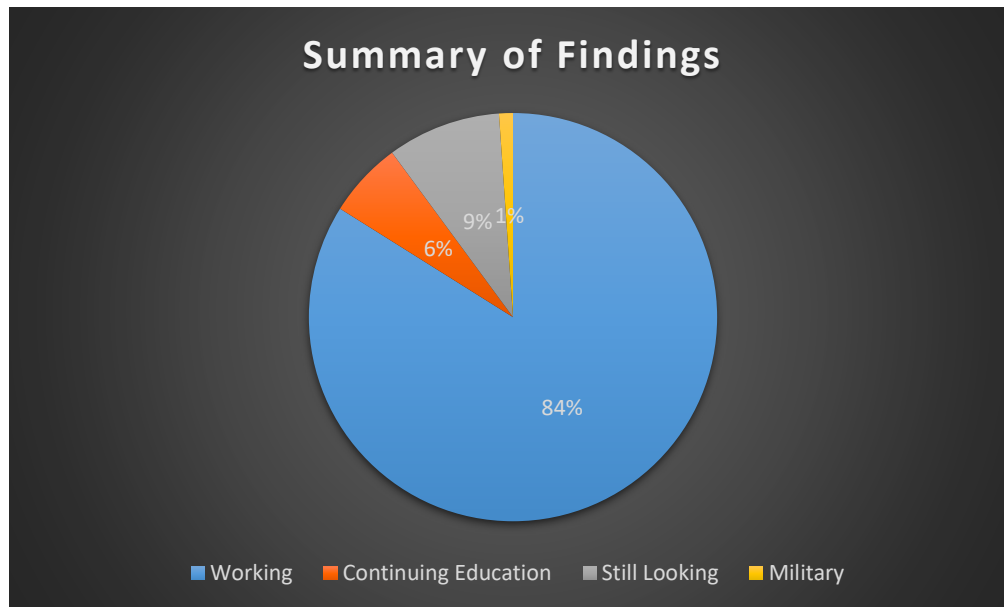
This report includes data from surveys administered to 106 Logan University alumni earning Bachelor's, Master's, or Doctorate degrees during the Summer 2022 trimester. Of that total, Career Services was able to verify the status of 81 alumni representing an overall response/knowledge rate of 83%.

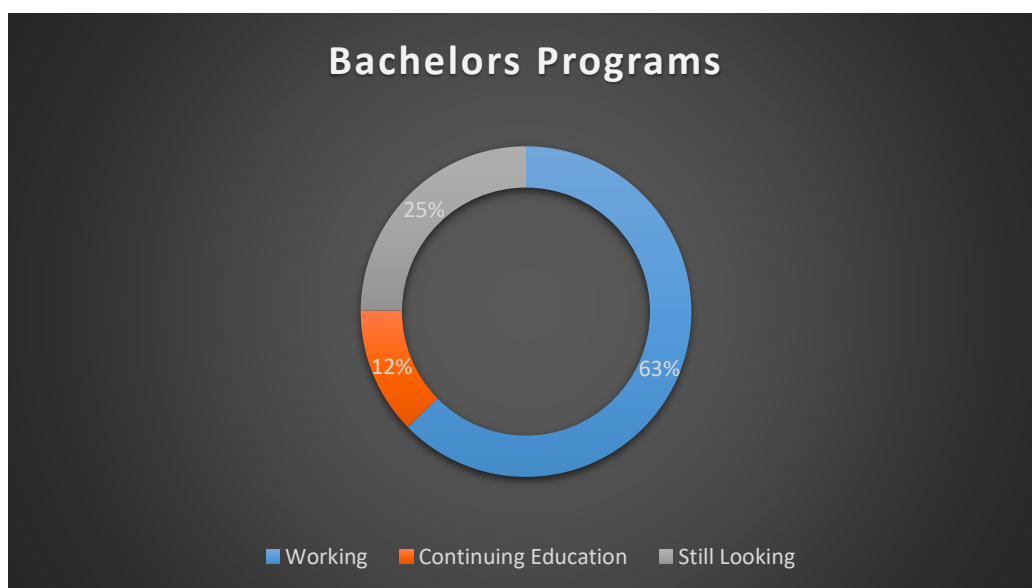
Findings

Out of 88 alumni responses, 75 (84%) were found to be employed full or part time, one (1.1%) was serving in the military, five (6%) reported continuing their education, eight graduates (9%) were actively seeking employment. 91% of Logan University graduates from the Spring 2022 trimester were found to be satisfactorily occupied within nine months of graduation. 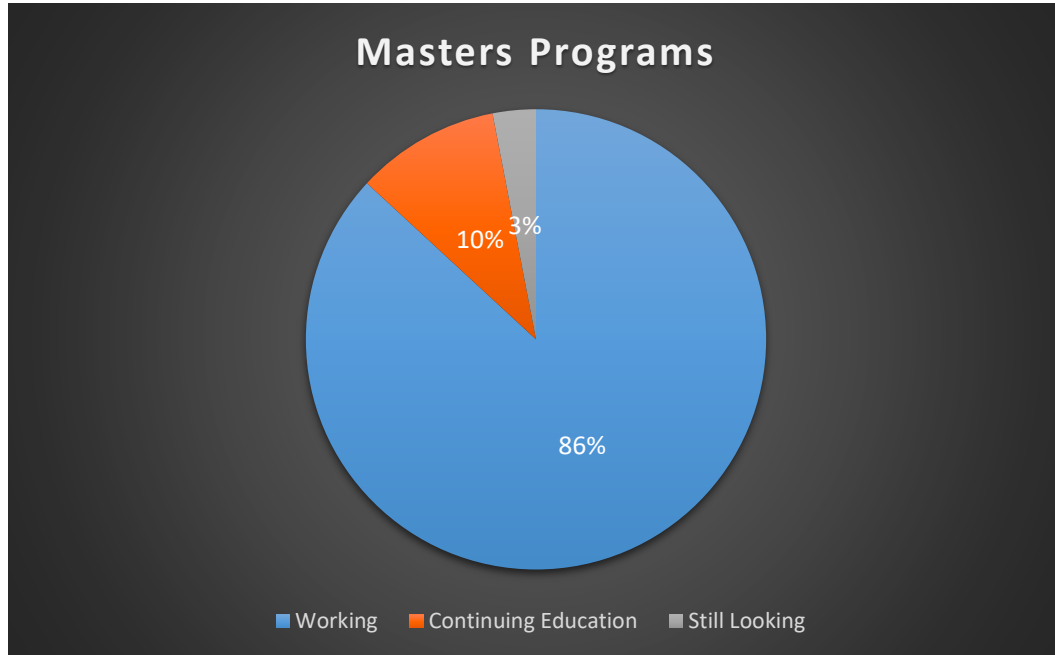
Bachelors Programs

Career Services verified the status of 16 graduates from the Human Biology program. Ten (63%) graduates reported that they were working full or part-time. Two (12.5%) students indicated that they were continuing their education. Four (25%) indicated that they were still actively seeking employment. Graph below.



Masters Programs

Results obtained from 29 alumni enrolled in Logan's Masters programs indicate that 25 (86%) were working full or part-time, three students (10%) reported continuing their education, and one graduate (3%) reported they were still seeking employment. Graph below.



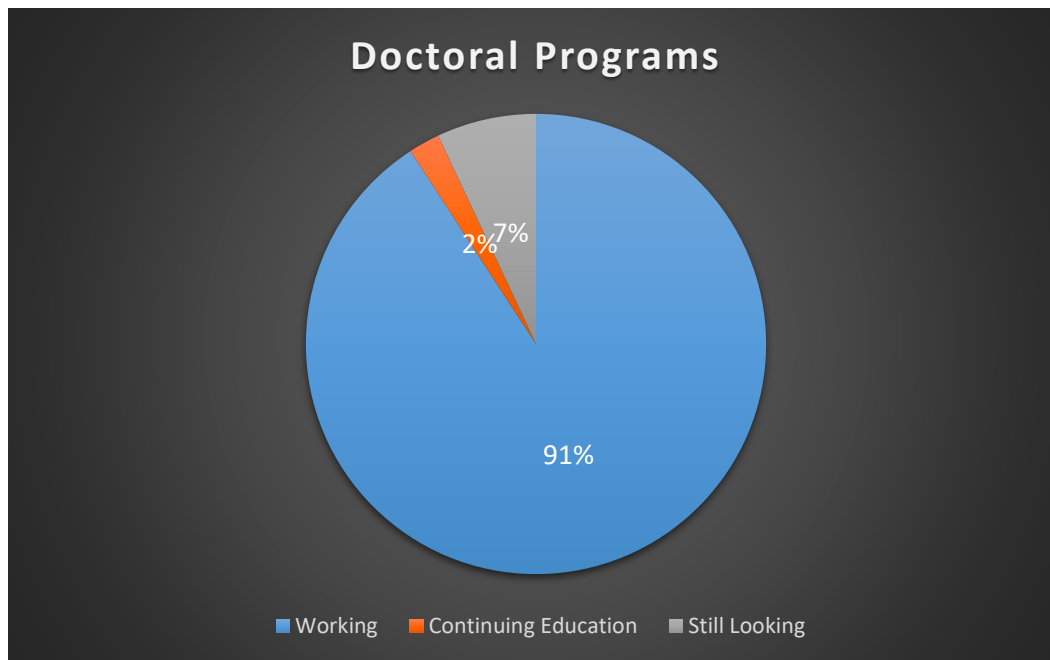
Students enrolled in the Master of Science in Nutrition and Human Performance program supplied 28 responses. Twenty five (89%) were found to be employed full or part-time. Three (11%) graduates were continuing their education. Table below.

We received one response from the Sports Science and Rehabilitation program and that alumni indicated that they were still seeking employment.

Doctoral Programs

Career Services obtained information from 44 survey participants enrolled in a doctoral program. Data indicated that 40 (91%) were working full or part-time. One respondent (2.2%) was continuing their education. Three (7%) graduates reported that they were still seeking employment. 93% of the graduates from Doctoral programs were satisfactorily occupied. Doctorate of Chiropractic

Chiropractic Students supplied 36 responses. Thirty-three (92%) were found to be employed full or part-time. Three graduates (8%) indicated that they were still seeking employment. Table below.

Doctor of Health Professions

Career Services was able to verify the status of seven students graduating from the DHPE program, all of whom (100%) were working full-time.
