DC Reinstatement Policy

Policy Statement

Logan University is committed to allowing students to achieve their goal of serving the public as chiropractic practitioners. In recognition of Logan's commitment to high academic standards, we acknowledge that students who have been dismissed should be allowed to remediate and demonstrate that they are able to achieve the academic success necessary to complete the Doctor of Chiropractic Program (DCP) with acceptable Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP).

To that end, students who have been academically dismissed from the College of Chiropractic (COC) as a result of Satisfactory Academic Progress criteria and Dismissal

Process may apply for reentry into the DC program pending satisfactory completion of a minimum of 20 semester credits/30 quarter credits of 300-level or above biological or natural sciences, with or without lab, from an accredited University or an equivalent to be determined by the COC Admissions Committee and/or Dean of the College. The COC Admissions Committee, which includes faculty representatives from the appropriate academic disciplines, shall review and approve the proposed coursework to ensure alignment with program learning outcomes.

A student who has been dismissed twice from the DC program will not be eligible for re-admissions under the re-instatement policy.

Procedures

Upon exhausting the Dismissal Appeal process students may:

1. Apply to and complete required credits from an accredited college or university.
2. If credits are obtained in either the undergraduate or graduate program at Logan University, the student must meet and fulfill all existing academic policies of the respective program.
3. Upon successful completion of the required credits, the student may reapply to the DC program. If all current prerequisite criteria for the DC program have been met, including maintain a "B" average through the 20 semester/30 quarter credit hours of study, the student's reapplication will be forwarded to the COC Admissions Committee.
4. The reapplication will be reviewed by the COC Admissions Committee. Their charge will be to determine if the required coursework has been successfully completed. The COC Admissions Committee shall include voting faculty members from the DC curriculum committee to ensure academic integrity in the readmissions process.
5. If the prerequisite criteria has been successfully completed, and with approval of the Dean or their designee, the student will be admitted to the program.
6. If the student is re-admitted, the student will qualify for credit for courses taken and passed with a grade of A or B within the three previous academic years in the DC program. The student will be admitted to the curriculum in effect at the time of their re-admittance.
7. Reentry into the DC program will be according to the SAP that is in effect at the time of reentry.
8. Reentered students will be placed on a provisional academic contract and must meet all requirements of the provisional contract for a minimum of two trimesters to maintain enrollment eligibility. An assigned faculty mentor and Academic Success Coach will review the students' progress during the provisional contract period and provide recommendations regarding continuation or additional support as needed.

All policy and regulations that relate to financial aid eligibility are separate and distinct from the DCP. Reentry does not entail, or entitle, the student to additional considerations regarding financial aid.

Students who are accepted for reentry with academic amnesty should be aware that while previous grades are not used to calculate the new grade point average, they will be used to evaluate SAP for financial aid purposes in accordance with Federal Financial Aid Regulations.
